New York Chamber Orchestra – Orchestra Biography

The New York Chamber Players is a Professional Chamber Orchestra of 42 players, it is dedicated to producing performances of mostly classical music. About 2/3 of the Orchestra is core and the remaining 1/3 is new at every production and is chosen through regular auditions; in NYC there is a wealth of talented musicians and we want to give the opportunity to all deserving professionals. The Artistic Director welcomes professionals from all nationalities and races as a reflection of the true spirit of New York City. The main mission is to promote live classical music through presentations of classical music to contemporary audiences, using different formats to enliven and inspire musical experiences. The formats include spontaneous communication with the audiences, unusual in most concert settings, as well as full awareness of proper alternative visual effects such as alternative lightings (*inserted sometimes during the performance of contemporary or modern music*) and / or insertion of dancers that can enrich the communication especially during the performance of contemporary music.

The organization will fulfill its mission by:

- Enhancing the career and musical activity of its artists, mostly young professionals graduated from colleges, universities and conservatories.
- Promoting classical music to contemporary audiences, through spontaneous communication with the public during concerts.
- Expanding beyond traditional presentation (*musicians in tuxedos, on a stage, silent except while playing music*)
- Giving particular attention to contemporary music and lesser known but great composers.

The New York Chamber Players is comprised of the best young professionals in New York City. They have graduated from the leading Universities and Conservatories in the U.S.A.

Even if they are at the highest technical and artistic level, they encounter great difficulties to enter the professional world.

They are coming from a kind of deceiving situation: they have a pretty busy schedule while they are attending their courses in the conservatories, and once they are graduated they encounter a complete lack of activity.

Usually they try a few auditions for major orchestras where the chance is very slim (usually the ratio is 1 job and 400 to 450 applicants applying for it).

One of the main aspects from NYCP mission statement is to make them feel that they are not alone in the professional world. The aim of the artistic director is to give a great encouragement for them to succeed.

While NYCP is aiming to the highest technical and artistic level, its mission statement is combining the Music Aspect with the Human Aspect.

The New York Chamber Players offers the community a fresh new modern way of running a professional chamber orchestra. While mastering and performing traditional composers, the orchestra also gives a strong emphasis to modern music as well as contemporary American composers who are the ambassadors of American culture.

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
