Latvian born pianist, Tatiana Balazs was praised by critics for her solo and orchestra appearances in the United States, Germany, Japan, Spain, France, Italy, Latvia, Hungary, and Russia.


She has performed with the Fort Worth Chamber Orchestra, the Tatiana at age 4, playing the piano and singing. She has taught numerous Masters program classes throughout the U.S. and Europe, including Indiana University, University of Texas, International Music Course in Spain, Long Beach University, Texas Wesleyan University, the Franz Liszt Academy, and the National conservatory of Music.

Her recordings include a unique unedited CD of Chopin 24 etudes, "Favorites"-works of Chopin, Liszt, Ravel, and most recent recording-" A Little Something for Everybody"-CD showing a great versatility of the artist performing a wide variety of music-classical, jazz, pop, country, gospel, boogie and Broadway. ## Tatiana Balazs - Reviews

CAPTIVATING PIANO CONCERT OF ALL OF CHOPIN'S ETUDES

Iserlohn. No one could have anticipated that an evening concert would produce such prodigious waves of enthusiasm as was the case on Wednesday, when the pianist Tatjana Balasz-Kulikova played the 24 piano etudes of Chopin. This likeable young artist gave the concert on the Rittersaal as a benefit for the children's sanatorium "Baldurin" in Riga, Latvia, her hometown.

As she walked onto the stage in her black gown which left her shoulders free, her natural and graceful appearance alone won the hearts of the spectators, who filled the hall to the last available seat. Without affectation and dramatic gestures sne allowed the sound of the works alone, played on the Steinway concert grand piano, to speak for themselves. And her performance was a miracle, a flawless transmission of the ideas and feelings of the composer, who in these works fused together unbelievable technical demands with the soulful depth of mature musicality.

As if animated by two brains, one guiding each of her hands in the extremely complicated finger movements, the artist's virtuosity—already in the first etude of Dpus 10—far exceeded anyone's notion of how these incredibly fast runs, with the simultaneous, finely honed melodic line, might sound if perfectly executed. Trills played in a headlong rush at breakneck speed, or tones played softly, cat-like, and legato passages supported by the pedal—all of these came with an admirable smiling ease to the ear of the listener. Performing these etudes at such a tempo and with such force requires not only an enormous physical effort but also a phenomenal feat of memory—and Tatjana B.—K. played everything from memory.

It was not only the virtuosic technical ability of B.-K. which so enthralled the audience, but also the obvious congruence between the artist's psyche and the pieces played. Two examples: the famous E-major etude sounded austere and elegiac, but not sentimental; the No. 6 in E-flat minor suggested restrained grief. The whirling bass notes of the 12th conjured up the picture of a burning city, as Chopin might have imagined the conquest of

No one would have believed that after the intermission the performance of Opus 25 would hold an even more intense experience in store, and yet it was so. Even more precise execution of the melodic line, even wilder fast passages, more strongly pounding ass trills, wilder arpeggios, broader chord expansions! And even more intense inwardness, whether in the scherzo-like rhythms of the F-major etude or the pensivelness of the C-sharp minor work, or in the graceful spiritedness of the No. 9 in 3-flat major. With bell-like pure discant tones, but also with troubled thoughts of storms and uproar, the three great etudes of Opus 25 come to a close: and, fittingly, after such a powerful musical presentation of great emotion, the audience burst forth in a storm of applause (there were two encores). They no doubt realized that they might never again be privileged to witness such a performance of these works of Chopin.

[Headline:] "Standing ovations for Tatjana Balazs / Benefit concert becomes a sensational event"

Altena - A truly great concert took place in Burg Holtzbrinck on Sunday evening; in fact, one would have to call it a sensational "happening."

The story behind this benefit concert featuring the pianist Tatjana Balazs-Kulikova has been well reported; several detailed articles about it have appeared in this newspaper. Ms. Balazs, who is also active as a piano teacher in the United States, will be performing a total of four times in her homeland (after Altena: in Iserlohn, Werdohl, and Lüdenscheid). The proceeds from all these concerts will go into a fund benefitting the children's sanatorium in Riga.

Two years ago Tatjana Balazs gave two concerts, in Altena and Iserlohn, for the same charitable cause. At that time friends of virtuoso piano music were full of praise for the mature

artistic performance of this soloist, who is still so young.

And this year too there were very demanding and diversified piano works on the program. Works of Sergej Prokofjew, Johannes Brahms, Maurice Ravel, and Frederic Chopin. "Powerful tonalities, but also music full of tender melody and virtuoso effects

The Sonata for Piano, No. 3, Opus 38, an early work of Prokofjew (who later, in keeping with Socialist Realism, borrowed heavily from early Russian music) already possesses the

elemental power and melodic structure of his subsequent works.

Nicolo Paginini's violin tonalities have inspired variations by many composers. The same is true of Johannes Brahms. The young planist performed the extremely demanding Opus 35 with great sensitivity for the mood changes so typical of Brahms' music. She achieved tones of impressive intensity.

And her rendition of Ravel's "La Valse" filled the auditorium with a blissful Viennese waltz atmosphere, conveyed through exciting, colorful effects. But amid the tonal images suggestive of

the ballroom the subtle morbidity of certain passages was not lost.

After the intermission came works of Chopin, creator of a piano art that borders on the poetic. The "Polonaise Fantasie," Opus 61, his last great work for piano, builds inexorably to a phenomenal climax. The four mazurkas (the national dance of Poland) contain, magical, imagerich tonalities. After a dream-like rendition of an andante spianto the high point of this truly brilliant concert came with the magnificent "Grande Polonaise Brillante," which culminated in a veritable musical fireworks display (and was played entirely from memory).

Tatjana Balazs-Kuklikova played with great technical elegance and with persuasive understanding of the music. In all instances her interpretations were highly polished and

The applause seemed unending. She played two encores, which were followed by standing ovations. In Altena such audience reaction is truly remarkable.




