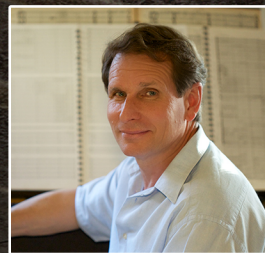
For Orchestra and Air Force Band

Originally commissioned for the Centennial of Powered Flight, by the U.S. Air Force Band of Flight and Dayton Philharmonic, Ronald Foster's *...on the Wings of Angels* is inspired by the pioneers of flight, while also paying musical homage to the souls who perished in flying accidents and aerial combat.

Incorporating the Air Force Hymn (without words), this one-of-a-kind composition honors the history of flight -- from the early days, the Hindenburg, World Wars I and II, Korea and Vietnam, the Challenger disaster, the USAF Thunderbirds crash (when all but one perished), and September 11. The work has been featured in the *League of American Orchestras Symphony* magazine, *ASCAP Playback* magazine, and by New

Music USA. Performances for 2028's 125th Anniversary of Powered Flight are being scheduled now.
